IFAD has made commitments on nutrition, tracked on an annual basis



IFAD is a member of the steering committee



Includes 60 countries that have committed to reduce malnutrition

Flagship: Neglected and Under-utilised Species (NUS)

Agricultural biodiversity
(agrobiodiversity) is a strategic
asset to fight food and nutrition
insecurity, climate change
vulnerability, and poverty



Food crops are estimated at 5,000 species yet global food systems are dominated by just 3 crops: rice, maize, and wheat that make more than 50% of human plant-based caloric intake and cover 40% of arable land globally

There are around 8800 livestock breeds of 38 different species in the world, providing a diversity of products and services (FAO)



RISK: Disappearance of crop and animal species diversity from production and food systems; Increased succeptibility to pests, diseases and infections for agri-food systems

WHY Neglected and Under-utilised Species (NUS)

- NUS include wild, semi- or fully domesticated plants from various food groups with diverse growth forms (field crops, trees, shrubs, vines, and others).
- NUS also include livestock species and fungi. NUS are an integral part of local cultures and food traditions.
- Diversity and nutritionally rich foods aligned to local needs and customs
- Fostering a climate-change-resilient food system by integrating traditional risk-management practices
- Empowering women, youth, Indigenous Peoples, to leverage their knowledge and generate income
