## About the Programme and Grant

- Part of Innovative Joint Sustainable Development Goals Fund
   Programme through support from European Union
- The initiative is focusing on Data for Digital Agricultural
   Transformation in Tanzania
- Implemented jointly with UN agencies, UNCDF (lead Un Agency) and FAO
- Contributing towards IFAD ICT4D Strategy (2019-2030)
- Aligned to the IFAD Private Sector Engagement Strategy (PSS)



# **Project Financing**


- Project Name: Data for Digital Agricultural Transformation for Tanzania
  - Countries and Projects Supported: Tanzania
  - **Duration**: 3 years, targeting 500,000 farmers (60% women; 20% youth) and 500 government extension officers (at least 30% women and 60% youth) across four regions
  - **Total Financing:** US\$3.65 million for the joint initiative, with in-kind contributions of US\$620,000
- IFAD will receive US\$950,000 in financing and provide in-kind support worth US\$200,000 through the Project Management Units of IFAD projects in Tanzania.
- Of the financing, IFAD will allocate US\$500,000 to provide catalytic grants—either directly or through a third party to private sector Agri-Tech companies selected competitively through an accelerator program.
- Additionally, IFAD will use US\$450,000 to assist the Ministry of Agriculture in developing a national data and interoperability framework.





#### Objective and Project Components of the Joint Programme

**Objective:** The overarching objective of the JP is to advance food systems transformation and digital connectivity, through enhanced public sector capabilities, public-private partnerships, digital innovation, and financing



- Component 1. Establishment of National standard for agriculture data framework and sharing mechanisms
- Component 2. Scaling Agri-techs through investment, technical assistance, and innovation for accelerating growth for smallholder farmers.
- Component 3. Smallholder farmers increase their use of digitally enabled products and services



#### **Expected Results**

- R1- Farmer registry data, across platforms and related ministries, is interoperable and guided by a data-sharing framework.
- **R2** National Agri-techs grow and scale their outreach to smallholder farmers because of improved data-driven decision-making, technical assistance, and access to capital.
- R3 Smallholder farmers increased their capacities to adopt digital agricultural solutions through improved digital literacy and the availability of digital solutions.




### Alignment to Ongoing work
