Project Area National / Focus on Northern provinces

IFAD Add. Financing:
US\$ 15 million (BRAM)

Original Total cost: US\$ 36.1 million

IFAD: US\$ 13.1 million

FONPLATA: US\$ 13.3 million

GoA: US\$ 6.7 million

(IFAD financed 36% of total cost)

Beneficiaries

- **Original outreach: 16 610 AFICI smallholders (15 785 households)**
- **Add. financing outreach: 5 009 AFICI* smallholders (+30%)**
40% women, 30% youth, 20% Indigenous people of 15.8K households



II. Objectives and relevant issues

GOAL: Improve the resilience of poor family farmers by promoting sustainable and inclusive production and commercialization systems that are adapted to climate change.

Components

C1: Investment for production and commercialisation

C2: Development of systemic support services for production and commercialisation

C3: KM, M&E and programme management



Relevant issues:

- ✓ **Development partnerships with 8 Provincial Governments**
- ✓ **5 alliances for technical assistance** through specialized entities have been signed
- ✓ Participatory diagnostics are ensuring that **PROSAF meets real communities' needs** for agroecological transition.
- ✓ **29 business plans** led by FFOs are currently **under implementation + 25 plans at design**



III. Rationale for an Additional Financing



Increased Resilience in the Face of Economic Shifts

A **new outcome focused on rural productive infrastructure** will be added to facilitate market access (rural roads and storing & processing centres) for small-scale beekeeping sector



First Sub-National Debt Operation (Entre Rios Province) for Lasting Impact

Additional financing will **reinforce provincial and local ownership of PROSAF**, empowering governments and stakeholders to **sustain and build on PROSAF outcomes** well beyond its completion.

Boosting Resilient Rural Infrastructure



Benefitted households through funding for productive rural infrastructure (especially in the beekeeping sector of Entre Ríos) enhancing:

- **Productivity**
- **Climate resilience**
- **Market access**
- **Private sector's engagement**
- **Climate funding from US\$ 3,7 m to 9,9 m**
