#### PROGRAMME RATIONALE

#### **Problem Context**

- High vulnerability to climate shocks (droughts, floods) and weak resilience of production systems.
- Limited adaptive capacities and weak management of productive and water infrastructures.
- Poor market-access and post-harvest infrastructure, with persistent gender and social inequalities.

#### Programme Logic



 Develop and climate-proof resilient productive and post-harvest infrastructures.



 Strengthen adaptive capacities and promote adoption of climate-smart agriculture practices.



 Support value-chain competitiveness through improved market access infrastructure, financing, women and youth empowerment and inclusion, and nutrition interventions.
