Focus Areas	Climate resilience and sustainable natural resource management, economic resilience through inclusive value chains and evidence-based policy engagement
Target groups	Rural smallholders, particularly those involved in livestock remote rural areas and communities, characterized by higher poverty and food in-security levels, vulnerability to climate change and water scarcity. poor smallholders and small-scale rural entrepreneurs with a focus on empowering rural Women and youth
Goal	To reduce rural poverty and enhance food and nutrition security by strengthening smallholder farmers and rural entrepreneurs' resilience to economic and climate shocks through efficient land and water management, inclusive access to finance and markets, and sustainable production, contributing to resilient and inclusive food systems.
Financing	Approx. US\$353 million + co-financing
Target group	879,000 people / 390,000 households

Detailed approach

Strengthen the resilience of rural farmers, women, and youth by encouraging sustainable resource use, efficient water management, community groups like Water User Associations (WUAs), climate-smart crops, nature-based solutions, biodiversity, soil conservation, and ecofriendly technologies for sustainable livelihoods.

Support rural farmers and entrepreneurs, especially women and youth, by promoting new agricultural technologies, better financing, improved facilities, strong farmer groups, and market partnerships to boost productivity and food security.

Strengthen pro-poor policy engagement by leveraging field experiences and amplifying evidence via the Nexus of Water, Food and Energy (NWFE) and allied programmes, fostering stakeholder collaboration, and scaling climate-smart, market-driven, socially inclusive agricultural and rural finance models within national policies and programmes.





Key Priorities of the COSOP



Private Sector Engagement

- Enhancing market-focused value chains via private sector involvement, collaboration, digital tools, and incentives.
- Boosted private sector investment in value chains and partnerships with aggregators and food processors.



South-South Triangular Cooperation

- Egypt plans to be a regional SSTC hub for Africa and MENA by utilizing Chinese expertise.
- The program includes
 Climate-Smart Agriculture
 (CSA), water-saving tech,
 Front Office support,
 inclusive value chains,
 agribusiness, export
 promotion, and
 incorporates digital
 learning and AI tools.



Partnerships

Strengthen partnerships with key stakeholders, including:

- UN agencies including RBAs
- Climate finance (GCF, AF, GEF)
- Development partners (GIZ, CIDCA, AECID,)

- Policy involvement
- Strengthening institutions and linking smallholder farmers to value chains
- Customized financial products and better infrastructure
- Utilizing IFAD's leadership in the NWFE Food Pillar to expand successful models and share knowledge





Other Elements of the COSOP



Loans and Grants

- The programme will be financed through a combination of loan instruments: 82% PBAS and 16% BRAM and 2% Climate Change Top-Up under IFAD13
- Potential co-financing with GEF, GCF, AF and GIZ, AECID and CIDCA.



Country-level Policy Engagement

- Support strengthening of private veterinary services, and governance of Pasture User Unions (PUUs)
- Technical assistance and analytical support to build institutional capacity for policy development, (with World Bank, ADB, and FAO)



Capacity Building

- Strengthening Community-Based Organizations (CBOs) and Participating Financial Institutions' (PFIs) capacities including Agricultural Cooperatives, Marketing Associations, Water Users Associations and strengthening the voice of Women and youth.
- IFAD will be strengthening the capacities of the PMUs by embedding CC and KM specialists
- Ensure coordination between MALR and MWRI on the field level



Knowledge Management

- Strengthening knowledge generation, sharing, and application to refine strategies in the food, water and climate pillars
- Training, workshops, and case studies focusing on CSA to enhance productivity and resilience
- KM products will inform policy dialogue.





Lessons Learned to be applied by COSOP 2025-2030

Innovative and sustainable irrigation models

Utilizing solar powered systems for drip irrigation demonstrate effective national-level practices using clean energy, reducing diesel costs.

Sustainability of interventions addressing water use efficiency warrant a higher emphasis on operational and maintenance arrangements and cost recovery pathways.

Explicit and actionable poverty targeting strategies

To enhance the outreach to most vulnerable populations, maximise impact, optimise the use of scarce resources and support scalability.
