COSOP at a glance	
Duration	2026 to 2031 (6 years)
Focus Areas	Provinces and districts with relatively high poverty and climate vulnerability, the potential for diversified production systems and value chain development.
Target groups	Rural smallholder famers and fisherfolk, multidimensional poor, landless, marginalised and climate vulnerable households.
Goal	Contribute to inclusive and accelerated rural poverty reduction, enhance climate resilience, and improve food security through pursuing sustainable agriculture modernisation and commercialisation.

### Strategic Objective 1: Increased income and food security of small-scale producers

#### **Detailed Approach:**

- Froductivity & Diversification Introduce climate-smart irrigation and improved technologies to boost yields and diversify crops.
- ♦ Climate-Smart Agriculture Promote efficient water use, community capacity building, and awareness on climate risks.
- **Post-Harvest & Nutrition -** Strengthen post-harvest technologies, value addition, and nutrition-sensitive farming.
- 🔭 Sustainability & Natural Resource Management Scale up sustainable farming and NRM for climate adaptation.
- **Risk Mitigation -** Explore climate and disaster-resilient insurance schemes for smallholders.

## Strategic Objective 2: Improved access to agricultural markets and services

#### **Detailed Approach:**

- Innovation & Entrepreneurship Support business innovation, agripreneurship, and access to finance.
- Demand-Driven Agriculture Shift from supply-led to demand-responsive agricultural systems.
- **Partnerships -** Engage private agribusinesses, input suppliers, and traders as co-investors and partners.
- **in Institutional Capacity -** Strengthen technical, organizational, and market capacities for inclusive growth.

#### Private Sector Engagement

### **Key Priorities:**

- •Enable private sector participation in agriservices, value chains, and investment.
- Improve policy and financing frameworks for smallholders, women, and youth.
- •Strengthen partnerships with government, financial institutions, and private sector to support evidence-based policy dialogue.



#### South-South and Triangular Cooperation (SSTC)

#### **Key Priorities:**

- Facilitate knowledge exchange and technology transfer for climate-smart, competitive, and resilient agriculture.
- Promote joint ventures and investment linkages between public and private sectors for local and export markets.
- Leverage regional platforms such as SAARC, ASEAN, and trade fairs



#### Strategic Partnerships

#### Key Priorities:

- Deepen collaboration with GoSL and ministries for policy reform, counterpart funding, and scaling up investments.
- •Strengthen cofinancing and coordination with partners (ADB, WB, OPEC, JICA, EU, Climate Funds)
- Align with the UNSDCF and UN agencies on climate-smart agriculture, nutrition, and resiliencebuilding initiatives.



## Sustainability and Scaling Up

#### **Key Priorities:**

- Build capacity of smallscale producers and institutions.
- •Promote sustainable natural resource management through long-term 4P partnerships.
- •Strengthen government capacities in policy formulation and implementation.
- Scale up IFAD innovations across the sector.
