## **Addendum**

Executive Board  $-100^{\rm th}$  Session Rome, 15-17 September 2010

For: Approval

### Recommendation for approval.

Pursuant to the Procedures for the Use of the Advance Commitment Authority (ACA), the President of the Fund shall report regularly to the Executive Board on the status of resources available for commitment, including the management of the ACA. At each session, the Executive Board shall approve the total resource commitment to be made through the ACA. No additional use of ACA is being requested for approval at this session of the Board. The Executive Board is hereby requested to authorize the President to conclude agreements for loans and grants approved by the Board at its 100<sup>th</sup> session in September 2010 and for those to be approved through the lapse-of-time procedure as per attachment III to this document.

### Resources available for commitment

- 1. For the information of the Executive Board, and as stated in document EB 2010/100/R.11, Management has prepared an update of the estimated resources available for commitment under IFAD's Regular Programme. The aforementioned document had estimated that no additional advance commitment authority (ACA) was required. Attachment IV provides a further analysis of net flows from 1 January to 31 August 2010, currently estimated at US\$549.5 million. Taking into account the net inflows for the eight-month period, loan and grant commitments amounting to US\$444.3 million² and ACA of US\$75.3 million already approved at the April 2010 session of the Board, no additional ACA is requested at this session of the Executive Board (attachment IV).
- 2. Attachment I provides details of loans and grants approved by the Board at its ninety-ninth session.
- 3. Attachment II provides details of loans and grants proposed to the current session of the Board for a total amount of US\$127.6 million. Based on the exchange rate in force as at 31 August 2010, such loans and grants amount to SDR 84.5 million. In addition, attachment III provides details of loans and grants to be committed and approved through the lapse-of-time procedure for 2010, amounting to US\$40.6 million.

#### Recommendation

4. Based on the estimated resource position as at 31 August 2010, the Executive Board, having regard to article 7, section 2(b) of the Agreement Establishing IFAD and noting estimated net inflows for the eight-month period to 31 August 2010 amounting to US\$549.5 million and loan and grant commitments amounting to US\$444.3 million,<sup>2</sup> and considering that ACA for US\$75.3 million has already been approved during the current year, notes that no additional use of ACA is being requested for approval at this session of the Board. The Executive Board authorizes the President to conclude agreements for loans and grants approved by the Executive Board at its 100<sup>th</sup> session in September 2010 and for those to be approved through the lapse-of-time procedure, as indicated in attachment III to this document. In addition, the Board requests the President to report to the Executive Board at its next and subsequent sessions on the resources available for commitment, loans and grants approved, and the use of ACA.
