## Planned project activities including those proposed and approved under lapse-of-time procedure 2011-2012

- 1. At the second session of the Executive Board (EB/2), it was agreed that information on planned project activities would be presented to the Board regularly to enable representatives to keep abreast of developments in IFAD's project/programme pipeline and prospective lending and, should they so desire, to comment on planned operations at an appropriate stage of the development cycle.
- 2. To this end, part I of this document provides a comprehensive listing, by stage of processing and by region, of all projects and programmes that have entered the pipeline as part of results-based country strategic opportunities programmes or after approval of concept notes. In addition, as communicated to the Executive Board in September 2003 (EB 2003/79/R.29/Rev.1), IFAD has made available on its public website – at <a href="https://www.ifad.org/operations/pipeline/index.htm">www.ifad.org/operations/pipeline/index.htm</a> – information on projects and programmes that have reached an advanced stage of design and are thus likely to be presented at a future session of the Board. Each of these operations is described in a two-page information note, which is updated on completion of each major step in the project cycle. As indicated to the Board at the ninety-seventh session (EB 2009/97/R.37), these information notes are now made available only in English and the language of the country concerned. Following discussions with Board members regarding the desirability of receiving information on planned interventions well in advance, dates for future key country meetings are provided to facilitate incountry discussion/consultation. Additional details of future country meetings and project- and programme-related documentation are available on request from the primary IFAD contact given in the document. Details of supplementary loans/grants to be considered by the Board during the 2011/2012 Board sessions that are part of approved, ongoing projects are not reflected in the current document or summarized in information notes.
- 3. At its ninety-eighth session held in December 2009, the Board endorsed the proposal to streamline the approval process for investment projects and programmes (EB 2009/98/R.15/Rev.1) and adopted rule 24 of the Rules of Procedure of the Executive Board. For IFAD-funded projects/programmes, the Fund will apply two approval procedures: (i) the lapse-of-time (LOT) procedure; and (ii) the standard procedure. Under the LOT procedure, eligible proposals meeting specific criteria will be considered approved by the Executive Board if no request for formal discussion by the Executive Board is received by a specified deadline. All IFAD-funded projects/programmes that do not fall under the LOT procedure will follow the existing standard procedure for Board approval.
- According to the LOT procedure, proposals for projects/programmes submitted by the President pursuant to article 7, section 2(c) of the Agreement Establishing IFAD shall be considered approved if no request for consideration during a session of the Executive Board is received from any member within 30 days of the delivery of the document to the members. At its 100<sup>th</sup> session, the Board approved the following methodology and principles that IFAD Management will apply in implementing the LOT procedure (EB 2010/100/R.41): (i) except for large grants regulated by the IFAD Policy for Grant Financing, no projects/programmes will be deemed approved under the LOT procedure if the negotiated financing agreement has not been delivered to members; (ii) negotiated financing agreements will be delivered to members at least five days prior to the lapse of 30 days following delivery of the proposals (i.e. President's reports and project/programme design documents); and (iii) in the event that the negotiated financing agreement is not posted on the Fund's website within the stipulated time, in accordance with (ii) above, and/or there are substantial changes with respect to the terms and conditions presented to members in the President's report, the proposal will be deemed withdrawn from the LOT

- process. Such proposal may be resubmitted for approval later, either under the LOT procedure or at a regular session of the Executive Board.
- 5. The document also includes information on the proposed approval type: part I-A contains a column showing the approval type for each project/programme and part I-B lists projects/programmes (and supplementary loans/grants) that are currently proposed for approval through the LOT procedure.
- 6. Part I-B also provides a list of all projects/programmes (and supplementary loans/grants) approved through the LOT procedure in the preceding period. This procedure has also been adopted for global/regional and country grants exceeding US\$500,000 in line with the revised grant policy (EB 2009/98/R.9/Rev.1).
- 7. In September 2006, the Executive Board approved a new framework for a results-based country strategic opportunities programme (RB-COSOP) (EB 2006/88/R.4). The RB-COSOP content is updated to reflect experience with project implementation and evolving country circumstances. Consequently, RB-COSOP guidelines and a source book on formulation and implementation were issued in 2010. RB-COSOPs provide a framework for entry of projects/programmes into IFAD's official pipeline. Some of these pipeline projects/programmes will be processed within the current 2010-2012 cycle of the performance-based allocation system (PBAS), while others will be included in subsequent PBAS allocation periods. Part II provides information on planned COSOPs and subregional strategic opportunities programmes (SRESOPs) and, where available, identifies dates of forthcoming country meetings and stakeholder consultation meetings.<sup>1</sup>
- 8. As agreed at the Board session in April 2001 (EB 2001/72/R.28), part III of this document provides information on all COSOPs and SRESOPs reviewed to date by the Operational Strategy and Policy Guidance Committee (OSC) as well as those reviewed by the Board.

### Overview

9. This document includes the 60 projects/programmes currently in IFAD's official pipeline; others will be identified during the course of the year. The OSC plans to review concept notes for projects/programmes in Brazil, Maldives, Niger and Turkey in the near future.

- 10. In terms of geographical distribution, the pipeline includes 8 projects/programmes in West and Central Africa, 11 in East and Southern Africa, 16 in Asia and the Pacific, 12 in Latin America and the Caribbean, and 13 in the Near East and North Africa.
- 11. A supplementary Debt Sustainability Framework (DSF) grant of US\$2.5 million for the ongoing Rural Livelihoods Improvement Programme – Attapeu Province in the Lao People's Democratic Republic will be presented to the 102<sup>nd</sup> session of the Executive Board.
- 12. IFAD will propose use of the LOT procedure for the approval of one project during the period January-May 2011 (Project for Reviving Food Crop and Small Livestock Production in the Savannah, Central African Republic). Other projects/programmes and supplementary loans/grants planned for approval through the LOT procedure are listed in Part I-B. The LOT procedure will also be used for global/regional grants totalling US\$8.1 million during the January-May 2011 period, US\$24.8 million during the May-September 2011 period and US\$4.0 million during the September/ December 2011 period. All proposals are subject to quality enhancement/quality assurance (QE/QA) review. (For more details, see part I-B.)



<sup>&</sup>lt;sup>1</sup> As a result of lessons learned from the COSOP process since 2007, countries with three or more projects in a given PBAS cycle will normally require a full COSOP. Borderline cases such as transitional situations with three or more operations but a relatively modest PBAS allocation, e.g. below US\$15.0 million, will require guidance from Management. Countries with only two operations in the pipeline but with a PBAS allocation of a US\$20.0 million or above will require a COSOP to guide overall country engagement.

- 13. The COSOP for India will be reviewed at the 102<sup>nd</sup> session of the Board, while COSOPs for Benin, Liberia, Mozambique, Zambia, China and the Lao People's Democratic Republic are currently scheduled for presentation at the September 2011 Board session.
- 14. Interventions will continue focusing on priority areas as identified in the IFAD Strategic Framework 2007-2010, the draft IFAD Strategic Framework 2011-2015 (to be reviewed by the Board in May 2011), the IFAD Medium-term Plan 2011-2013 and the relevant results-based COSOPs or concept notes. Enabling poor rural people to improve their food security, raise their incomes and strengthen their resilience will be at the centre of IFAD's work.
- 15. IFAD's Eighth Replenishment of US\$1.2 billion will contribute to expanding the programme of work to US\$3.0 billion for 2010-2012. Consistent with the objective of mobilizing additional resources for agricultural development in developing Member States, IFAD's future interventions will increase partnerships with national and international development partners willing to invest their resources in IFAD's programmes through cofinancing. As shown in the table and graph below, IFAD has increased cofinancing by nearly 140 per cent, to a total of US\$1.6 billion in 2010.

16. Building on these achievements, IFAD will endeavour to further expand the programme of work in 2011 through both traditional and new partnerships. One concrete example is the Spanish Food Security Cofinancing Facility Trust Fund (Spanish Trust Fund), which was approved in September 2010. Through a loan of

- over EUR 285 million (or about US\$400 million) and a grant of EUR 14.5 million from the Government of Spain, IFAD will have the opportunity to scale up the projects it funds and achieve a greater and more meaningful impact.
- 17. At its 102<sup>nd</sup> session and subsequent sessions, the Board will consider proposals for cofinancing through the Spanish Trust Fund for the following projects approved in 2010: Botswana, Mozambique, Uganda and Dominican Republic. Proposals currently being considered for Spanish Trust Fund cofinancing in 2011 are Argentina, Bangladesh, the Plurinational State of Bolivia, Colombia, Ecuador, El Salvador, Georgia, Ghana, Madagascar, Senegal and South Africa. In 2012, Brazil, Cape Verde, Equatorial Guinea, Gabon, Kenya, Lebanon, Mauritius, Mexico, Swaziland, Tunisia, Uzbekistan and Venezuela (Boliviarian Republic of) are expected to benefit from cofinancing under the Spanish Trust Fund.<sup>2</sup>
- 18. The Smallholder Commercialization Programme proposal in Sierra Leone will also be reviewed at the 102<sup>nd</sup> Board session for which US\$50.0 million cofinancing is expected to be provided through the Global Agriculture and Food Security Program (GAFSP).
