- 1. At its ninety-eighth session in December 2009, the Executive Board authorised the President of IFAD to approve, on behalf of the Board, grants not exceeding the equivalent of US\$500,000, with the exception of grant financing to the for-profit private sector, and to report annually to the Executive Board on the use of such authority.
- 2. A description is attached of the grants approved under this agreement in 2011, up to and including 31 December 2011. These grants are listed and described by relevant division. The grants were subject to the criteria and approval process presented in the Revised IFAD Policy for Grant Financing, which was approved in December 2009 (EB 2009/98/R.9/Rev.1).
