## Planned project activities, 2013-2015

1. The information provided in this document is intended to enable representatives to keep abreast of developments in IFAD's project/programme pipeline and prospective lending and, should they so desire, to comment on planned operations at an early stage of the development cycle.
2. It reflects current IFAD approval procedures and investment activities: (i) the standard procedure and (ii) the lapse-of-time (LOT) procedure as outlined in the Implementation of rule 24 of the Rules of Procedure of the Executive Board on the lapse-of-time procedure.
3. It also reports on the allocation of resources from the Spanish Food Security Cofinancing Facility Trust Fund and on specific planned activities under the Adaptation for Smallholder Agriculture Programme (ASAP).<sup>1</sup>
4. Part I of this document provides a comprehensive listing of all projects and programmes that have entered the pipeline as part of results-based country strategic opportunities programmes (RB-COSOPs) or after approval of concept notes. Table 1 lists the projects and programmes which are planned for submission to the Executive Board under the standard procedure. Table 2 provides a list of proposed and eligible projects and programmes planned for consideration under the LOT procedure. Table 3 reports on the proposed county-specific and global/regional grants currently planned for approval under the LOT procedure.
5. Part II – Table 1 provides information/comments on planned RB-COSOPs.<sup>2</sup>
6. Starting in 2011, and in line with efforts to enhance its efficiency and provide all relevant information in a timely manner to Members, IFAD undertook a review of the Planned Project Activities (PPA) document. Since then, the PPA document production process has been streamlined. This has resulted in a much more rationalised and efficient production process. Management will continue to provide Members with up-to-date information on the Fund's pipeline of financing activities as a basis for future partnership. In this regard, the existing planned project activities page on IFAD's website is being updated and all documentation of projects and programmes for consideration of respective Executive Board sessions is now posted online.

<sup>2</sup> As a result of lessons learned from the COSOP process since 2007, countries with three or more projects in a given PBAS cycle will normally require a full COSOP. Borderline cases such as transitional situations with three or more operations but a relatively modest PBAS allocation, e.g. below US\$15.0 million, will require guidance from Management. Countries with only two operations in the pipeline but with a PBAS allocation of a US\$20.0 million or above will require a COSOP to guide overall country engagement.

## Overview

7. Interventions will continue focusing on priority areas as identified in the IFAD Strategic Framework 2007-2010, the IFAD Strategic Framework 2011-2015, the IFAD Medium-term Plan for 2013-2015 and the relevant results-based COSOPs or concept notes. Enabling poor rural people to improve their food security and nutrition, raise their incomes and strengthen their resilience will be at the centre of IFAD's work.
8. This document includes 100 financing activities for a total of 59 projects/programmes currently in IFAD's official pipeline; others will be identified during the course of the year. These projects are scheduled for Board presentation in the period up to end-2015. Additional projects will be added to the pipeline for approval as their concept note is cleared by the Operational Strategy and Policy Guidance Committee (OSC) or as they enter the pipeline as part of results-based country strategic opportunities programmes. The OSC plans to review concept notes for projects/programmes in Armenia, Bhutan, Cote d'Ivoire, India, Jordan Niger and Pakistan in the near future. Table 1 provides information on the number of planned financing activities by region and type of financing and figure 1 illustrates the value of the official pipeline of financing in terms of geographical distribution.

## Adaptation for Smallholder Agriculture Programme (ASAP)

9. ASAP is a multi-donor, climate change adaptation programme within IFAD to channel climate and environmental finance to smallholder farmers. Launched in 2012, ASAP has been established as a fully mainstreamed and integrated programme within IFAD9.
10. ASAP aims to improve the climate resilience of large-scale rural development programmes and improve the capacity of at least 8 million smallholder farmers to expand their livelihood options in a rapidly changing environment. It is well positioned to increase the climate resilience of IFAD's approximately US\$1 billion per year of new investments. In doing so, ASAP embodies one of the most concrete and decisive steps a UN agency has ever undertaken to transform itself into a truly climate-smart organisation.
11. The first ASAP grant (Mozambique, US\$4.9 million) was approved by the IFAD Executive Board in September 2012. In September 2013 the Executive Board approved a second project in Bangladesh with ASAP financing of US\$15 million. Twelve new ASAP investments with a total financial volume of US\$110 million are in advanced stages of design (Bolivia, Chad, Djibouti, Ghana, Kyrgyzstan, Lesotho, Mali, Nicaragua, Nigeria, Rwanda, Viet Nam, and Yemen). Nine of these are aiming for approval in the period October-December 2013, three in the first half of 2014. Seven new ASAP investments are in early design stages (Cambodia, Cote d'Ivoire, Kenya, Malawi, Nepal, Niger, Sudan).

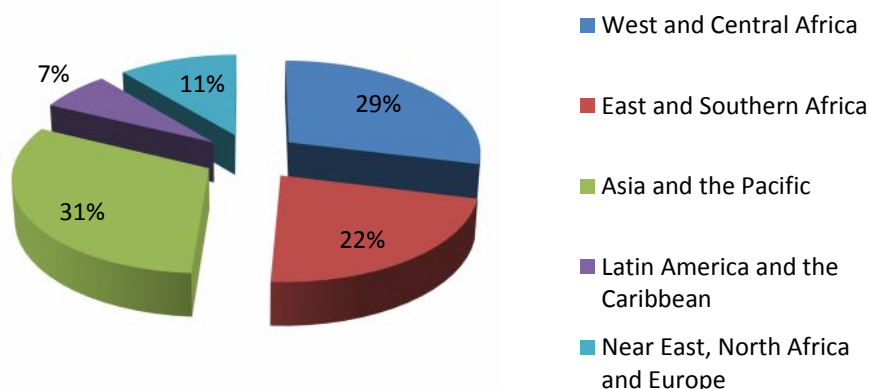

### Spanish Food Security Cofinancing Facility Trust Fund

- The Spanish Food Security Cofinancing Facility Trust Fund was approved in September 2010 (EB 2010/100/R.29/Rev.2) with a loan of EUR 285 million (approximately US\$400 million) and a grant of EUR 14.5 million from the Government of Spain to IFAD. In 2011 and 2012 a total amount of EUR 246 million was allocated to some 20 loans approved by the Board. As resources remained to be allocated, in April 2013 an agreement was reached with the Spanish Government to extend the commitment period up to December 2013. In September 2013 the Executive Board approved Spanish Trust Fund funds for the cofinancing of two projects, one in Cuba (EUR 20.7 million) and one in Viet Nam (EUR 7.9 million). The remaining amount will be submitted for Executive Board approval in the December 2013 to cofinance three projects in: Brazil (EUR 11.5 million), Gabon (EUR 4.2 million), and Zambia (EUR 9.0 million).
