Resumen de los fondos suplementarios recibidos, comprometidos y utilizados en 2015

I. Introducción

1. Los fondos suplementarios son recursos en forma de donaciones recibidos y administrados por el FIDA con arreglo a condiciones establecidas de común acuerdo entre este y el donante o los donantes, en beneficio de los Estados Miembros en desarrollo del Fondo. A diferencia de los recursos indicados en el artículo 4 del Convenio Constitutivo del FIDA, los fondos suplementarios no pertenecen al FIDA y son contribuciones a las que no se aplica “ninguna restricción acerca de su uso”.¹ Abarcan recursos que aportan los Estados Miembros del FIDA, países que no son miembros y otras fuentes, y se destinan a la cofinanciación de proyectos, la asistencia técnica, las actividades temáticas y el patrocinio de personas que participan en el Programa de Profesionales Asociados del FIDA.
2. Los fondos suplementarios cumplen una función fundamental dentro del modelo operativo global del FIDA. Al ser una forma de cofinanciación mediante donaciones destinada a proyectos que respalda el FIDA, estos fondos tienen un efecto atenuante sobre las condiciones generales del paquete de financiación para el gobierno prestatario, proporcionan oportunidades para poner a prueba actividades innovadoras, mejoran la coordinación entre donantes y, en comparación con la cofinanciación paralela, reducen la carga que pesa sobre los receptores. Estos fondos suplementarios con fines temáticos permiten al FIDA desarrollar tareas que no pueden ser financiadas a partir de su presupuesto administrativo, o por medio del sistema de asignación de recursos basado en los resultados (PBAS) o los sistemas de asignación de donaciones. Constituyen una fuente importante de financiación para proyectos del FIDA en materia de pueblos indígenas, organizaciones campesinas, remesas y otros temas de vital importancia para el mandato del Fondo.
3. Su función también es decisiva porque se destinan a financiar actividades no crediticias a nivel de los países, especialmente la gestión de los conocimientos, la actuación normativa, el fomento de las asociaciones, la asistencia técnica y la innovación, actividades todas ellas prioritarias para las cuales los recursos disponibles del presupuesto administrativo del FIDA, o de los sistemas del PBAS o de asignación de donaciones, son limitados. De estos fondos suplementarios también se beneficia en gran medida la colaboración entre los organismos con sede en Roma, ya que por lo menos nueve de los acuerdos en curso consisten en una asociación formal entre el FIDA y uno o más de estos organismos.
4. En cumplimiento de lo establecido en el Boletín del Presidente PB/2013/12, el presente documento facilita a la Junta Ejecutiva información actualizada sobre todos los fondos suplementarios recibidos, comprometidos y utilizados durante el ejercicio financiero de 2015. Las siguientes fuentes de fondos suplementarios se incluyen por primera vez en 2015: el Fondo de Adaptación (AF), el Fondo para el Medio Ambiente Mundial (FMAM), el Fondo para los Países Menos Adelantados (FPMA) y el Fondo Especial para el Cambio Climático (FECC) administrados por el FMAM, y el Programa Mundial para la Agricultura y la Seguridad Alimentaria (GAFSP). Asimismo, se proporciona información por separado sobre el Programa de Profesionales Asociados, si bien no se incluye en los cálculos generales.

II. Resumen de la cartera de fondos suplementarios del FIDA de 2015

5. **Situación.** Al 31 de diciembre de 2015, la cartera actual² de fondos suplementarios del FIDA consistía en 116 acuerdos con 16 Estados Miembros y sus organizaciones,³ y 13 organizaciones internacionales, fondos y otros asociados,⁴ por un monto total de USD 724,1 millones.⁵ En el cuadro 1 del apéndice se sintetizan los acuerdos vigentes.
6. **Fondos movilizados durante 2015.** En 2015, el FIDA movilizó un monto de USD 67 millones en fondos suplementarios para 15 acuerdos nuevos y dos sumas complementarias para acuerdos preexistentes. Entre los acuerdos nuevos se incluyen los concertados con el Fondo de Abu Dhabi para el Desarrollo (ADFD), la Fundación Bill y Melinda Gates, la Unión Europea (representada por la Comisión Europea), la FAO, Italia, la República de Corea, Luxemburgo, Suiza y el Programa Mundial de Alimentos (PMA). Por medio de estos acuerdos se brinda apoyo a intervenciones tendientes a aumentar la productividad agrícola y ganadera, mejorar la nutrición, empoderar a las organizaciones de agricultores, reforzar el impacto de las remesas en las zonas rurales y apoyar la investigación en el campo de la agricultura. Estonia y la Unión Europea proporcionaron las sumas complementarias que se destinaron, respectivamente, al acuerdo temático en curso y al Programa de Mejora de la Producción de Cereales en Kenia.
7. Durante 2015 se aprobaron otras 11 donaciones en apoyo de propuestas para el FMAM (9), el FPMA (1) y el FECC (1), para proyectos por un monto total previsto de USD 80,9 millones. Al 31 de diciembre de 2015 había en proceso de diseño nueve de estos proyectos y dos ya habían sido aprobados (uno de ellos había comenzado a ejecutarse).
8. En los cuadros 2A y 2B del apéndice se proporcionan los datos de todos los acuerdos.
9. **Fondos recibidos durante 2015.** El FIDA recibió pagos por valor de USD 88,4 millones en concepto de fondos suplementarios relacionados con acuerdos firmados en 2015 y años anteriores. De estos fondos, el 53 % provino de la Unión Europea y el 25 % del GAFSP, seguidos de los aportes de los Países Bajos, el FMAM, Suiza, Alemania y Dinamarca. Los pagos en virtud de acuerdos de fondos suplementarios se realizan o bien de conformidad con un calendario de pagos especificado en el acuerdo, o bien según las exigencias de liquidez de las actividades que se están financiando, sobre la base de los presupuestos y planes de trabajo anuales. En el cuadro 3 del apéndice se presentan los datos de todos los fondos recibidos durante 2015.



10. **Distribución temática.** Tal como se observa en el gráfico 1, la cartera actual de fondos suplementarios gira en torno a los siguientes temas (por orden de importancia respecto del total):


- La gestión de los recursos naturales y el cambio climático (28 %), principalmente en relación con el apoyo que prestan los fondos financieros dedicados al medio ambiente y el clima (el AF, el FMAM, el FPMA y el FECC). Estos fondos han sido muy importantes para facilitar el programa del FIDA de incorporación sistemática de cuestiones climáticas en sus actividades.
- La agricultura y la producción alimentaria sensibles a la nutrición (24 %), incluidas las actividades en apoyo de la producción agrícola sostenible y sensible a la nutrición. Se trata de los fondos que se reciben a través del GAFSP y otros asociados para la cofinanciación de proyectos, así como del apoyo temático prestado por Alemania, el Canadá, Irlanda y Suiza para impulsar la incorporación sistemática de cuestiones relacionadas con la nutrición y la reducción de las pérdidas en la producción de alimentos.
- El fomento de cadenas de valor, la gestión del riesgo y la inclusión financiera (22 %). Abarca el apoyo a las pequeñas y medianas empresas, las obras de infraestructura comercial, la financiación rural, el Fondo de financiación para remesas (FFR) y los fondos destinados a respaldar la gestión del riesgo por medio de la Plataforma para la gestión de riesgos agrícolas y el Servicio de gestión de los riesgos meteorológicos del FIDA y el PMA.
- La investigación agrícola para el desarrollo (15 %), que consiste sobre todo en fondos provistos por la Unión Europea en apoyo del Grupo Consultivo para la Investigación Agrícola Internacional (GCIAI).
- El apoyo a las organizaciones de agricultores (7 %), en el que se incluyen todos los fondos destinados a respaldar la labor del FIDA de asistencia a estas organizaciones, por ejemplo, el Programa de apoyo a las organizaciones campesinas en África y el Foro Campesino.
- El apoyo para aumentar el impacto de las actividades del FIDA (4 %), incluidas las relacionadas con cuestiones de género, mediante fondos destinados a respaldar investigaciones, evaluaciones y asistencia técnica.

11. **Distribución regional.** En el gráfico 2 se ilustra la distribución regional de la cartera de 2015. Prácticamente un 50 % de los fondos se destinan al África Subsahariana (África Oriental y Meridional [ESA] y África Occidental y Central [WCA]), un 4 % a América Latina y el Caribe (LAC), un 7 % a Asia y el Pacífico

(APR) y un 15 % a la región de Cercano Oriente, África del Norte, Europa y Asia Central (NEN). El 24 % restante corresponde a las actividades a escala mundial, o que no tienen un enfoque específicamente regional, e incluye el 15 % que se dedica a apoyar la investigación en el campo de la agricultura por intermedio del GCIAI.

12. **Utilización de los fondos.** La porción más grande de la cartera de fondos suplementarios actual (62 %) se destina directamente a la cofinanciación en el marco de proyectos del FIDA financiados por medio de préstamos y donaciones. Otro 23 % se asigna a fondos temáticos de un solo donante y de múltiples donantes, y a acuerdos temáticos para países concretos. Estos proporcionan una importante fuente de financiación para actividades no crediticias que se realizan a nivel regional y dentro de cada país. Por último, un 15 % se asigna directamente a respaldar la investigación en agricultura por intermedio del GCIAI.
13. **Fuentes de financiación.** En la actualidad, la Unión Europea es la principal fuente de fondos suplementarios. Al 31 de diciembre de 2015 estaban vigentes 20 acuerdos entre el FIDA y la Unión Europea por un monto de USD 313,6 millones, es decir, el 43 % del valor total de la cartera. Los fondos financieros mundiales dedicados al clima y el medio ambiente (el AF, el FMAM, el FPMA y el FECC) aportan otro 23 % (USD 167,8 millones) y los del GAFSP corresponden a un 15 % (USD 106,2 millones). Los Estados Miembros y sus organizaciones proporcionan el 17,5 % de la cartera actual de fondos suplementarios, y alrededor de un 1 % proviene de otras fuentes entre las que se incluyen asociados internacionales como la FAO, el FNUDC y la ONUDI, el Fondo Fiduciario de Asociados Múltiples del PNUD (financiado por Noruega y Suecia), la Fundación Bill y Melinda Gates y el Gobierno de Flandes.
14. Los Estados Miembros que aportan las sumas más grandes de fondos suplementarios en la cartera actual son los Países Bajos (USD 35,1 millones), Italia (USD 23,5 millones), el Canadá (USD 14,1 millones), Suiza (USD 9,99 millones) y España (USD 8,5 millones).
15. El 35 % de los fondos suplementarios que aportan los Estados Miembros son en forma de confinanciación para proyectos, y el resto como apoyo temático destinado a la investigación, a mejorar el acceso a la financiación y los mercados rurales, a las organizaciones de agricultores y otros temas. Las organizaciones y fondos financieros internacionales aportan recursos suplementarios destinados principalmente a la confinanciación de proyectos (68 %). La Unión Europea, concretamente, es una importante fuente de apoyo temático destinado a la investigación agrícola, al que le sigue el que se presta al fomento de cadenas de

valor y la inclusión financiera, la producción de alimentos y la nutrición, y las organizaciones de agricultores. En general, los fondos suplementarios que se utilizan para cofinanciación de proyectos se destinan sobre todo al África Subsahariana (62 %), seguida de la región de NEN (24 %).

16. Desde 1978, en los estados financieros consolidados del FIDA presentados a la Junta Ejecutiva se incluye anualmente un estado de las contribuciones suplementarias acumulativas, desglosadas por fuente de proveniencia. Los Estados Miembros que han hecho los mayores aportes de fondos suplementarios han sido Bélgica (USD 161,5 millones, incluido el Fondo Belga de Seguridad Alimentaria), los Países Bajos (USD 116,3 millones), Italia (USD 57,0 millones) y el Reino Unido de Gran Bretaña e Irlanda del Norte (USD 35,9 millones). Noruega, Suiza, Suecia, el Canadá, Dinamarca, España y Finlandia⁶ también han realizado aportes de importancia (de entre USD 10 millones y USD 30 millones cada uno en fondos suplementarios acumulativos). Las principales contribuciones de países que no son Estados Miembros del FIDA y otras fuentes provienen de la Unión Europea (USD 491,9 millones), el GAFSP (USD 106,2 millones), el FMAM (USD 106,0 millones) y el FPMA/FECC (USD 88,3 millones).
17. **Programa de Profesionales Asociados del FIDA.** El Programa de Profesionales Asociados del FIDA, por medio del cual los gobiernos miembros tienen la posibilidad de patrocinar a jóvenes universitarios para que hallen empleo en el FIDA, también se incluye dentro de la categoría general de contribuciones suplementarias. En 2015 se incorporó a ocho nuevos beneficiarios del programa, lo cual hizo elevar a 12 el número total de contratados al 31 de diciembre de 2015. De estos 12, siete se desempeñan en la Sede del FIDA y el resto están destinados a oficinas del FIDA en el país (Kenya, Nigeria, el Senegal y el Sudán). Los países patrocinantes son los Países Bajos (tres, de los cuales dos son ciudadanos de Estados Miembros de la Lista C), Alemania (tres), Italia (dos), Suiza (dos), Dinamarca (uno) y Finlandia (uno). En 2015 se recibieron fondos por un total de USD 2,2 millones para el Programa de Profesionales Asociados.
18. **Acuerdos concluidos y cerrados durante 2015.** Durante 2015 se cerraron los ejercicios financieros de 12 acuerdos de fondos suplementarios. Al 31 de diciembre de 2015 había otros 18 acuerdos en curso de cerrarse, de los cuales dos (los acuerdos con Finlandia y el Fondo de la OPEP para el Desarrollo Internacional [OFID]) estaban cancelados de forma parcial. Los datos sobre los proyectos concluidos y cerrados en 2015 se presentan en el apéndice, en los cuadros 4A y 4B, respectivamente.

III. Conclusión y orientaciones estratégicas

19. Los 116 acuerdos de fondos suplementarios que componen la cartera actual, por un valor de USD 724,1 millones, demuestran el papel fundamental que cumplen estos fondos en la financiación de las actividades encabezadas por el FIDA. Asimismo, ponen de manifiesto su valor como instrumento de colaboración con una amplia variedad de asociados, desde las Naciones Unidas y otras organizaciones internacionales, hasta fundaciones y grandes entidades donantes de carácter multilateral como la Unión Europea.
20. En los próximos años el FIDA continuará movilizando fondos suplementarios, junto con sus recursos básicos, para destinarlos a la cofinanciación por medio de donaciones de sus proyectos de inversión, y a continuar su labor temática y en materia de actividades no crediticias en los planos nacional, regional y mundial.

21. En este momento el FIDA está comprometido activamente en conseguir contribuciones para el Fondo para refugiados, migrantes y desplazados forzados en pro de la estabilidad rural, que le permitirá sacar partido de su ventaja comparativa en el ámbito de las actividades tendientes a abordar las dimensiones rurales de la actual crisis causada por las migraciones y los desplazamientos forzados.
22. Los fondos suplementarios también tendrán un papel fundamental en la segunda fase del Programa de Adaptación para la Agricultura en Pequeña Escala (ASAP2), que tiene una meta de movilización de USD 100 millones en fondos suplementarios destinados a apoyar los esfuerzos por incorporar sistemáticamente las cuestiones relacionadas con el clima en las actividades del FIDA (entre otros, por medio de la aplicación de los procedimientos del FIDA para la evaluación social, ambiental y climática) y a financiar la creación de capacidad, la asistencia técnica y otros tipos de apoyo que reciben los beneficiarios de fondos del FIDA.

In 2013, the TAF mid-term review revealed that the number of opportunities/investments where outgrowers' schemes can be developed is much smaller than initially envisaged for this project. In addition, the SME window is more limited than initially foreseen, with the type of targets outlined mostly suitable for medium sized enterprises. The review highlighted that the TAF Rural Finance component, designed to complement the AAF Rural Finance component, has thus far not been realized, limiting opportunities for finance through the TAF projects linked to AAF investments. <p>In 2006, with initial funding from Spain (EUR 2 million) and the EU (EUR 4 million), a multi-donor Financing Facility for Remittances (FFR) was established at IFAD to link migration and development issues, supporting capacity-building, advocacy and research in areas related to migration and remittances and piloting innovative projects to enhance the development impact of remittances. The FFR has now grown to become one of the most relevant actors in the field of remittances worldwide. To date the FFR has implemented nearly 50 innovative projects in more than 45 countries worldwide, with the creation of a network of around 200 partners from the public, private, and civil society sectors. While the multi-donor FFR has been managed as one facility, relevant agreements with Spain, Luxemburg, the EU and UNCDF have been signed as independent agreements and require independent financial reporting. During 2015 new supplementary funds agreements were established with Switzerland, Luxembourg and the EU.</p>

<p>The Support to Farmers' Organizations in Africa Programme (SFOAP) was established in 2009 with EUR 5 million financing from the EU and US\$1.5 million financing from IFAD. It was the first programme to be initiated by the four regional networks of FOs in sub-Saharan Africa (EAFF, PROPAC, ROPPA and SACAU). In 2012 Italy, Finland and Switzerland agreed to jointly co-finance SFOAP's 2012 management activities to support SFOAP's transition from pilot phase to a main phase. The main phase was launched in January 2013 through additional supplementary funds by the EU (EUR 15 million), France (EUR 1 million), Switzerland (EUR 2 million), and US\$2.5 million from IFAD. This phase builds on the successes and lessons learned from the pilot phase and scales up programme activities and outreach. The programme aims to further strengthen and consolidate the institutional capacity of FOs and give them a greater say in agricultural policies and programmes. It also supports the development of FOs' economic services to facilitate the integration of smallholder farmers in value chains. The addition of a fifth regional network, the UMAGRI, has expanded the geographical area of the main phase to the North Africa region. The programme now supports 68 national farmers' organizations (NFOs) in 49 countries, their five regional networks and the PAFO. In addition, the Medium-Term Cooperation Programme with Farmers' Organisations in Asia and the Pacific (MTCP 2) aims to strengthen the capacities of farmers' organizations in Asia and the Pacific to deliver better, improved and inclusive services to their members and to engage in effective dialogues with governments. In 2015 the EU agreed to support MTCP2 with additional EUR14.4 million. Together with SFOAP, the Farmers' Fighting Poverty in Africa (FFP/AFRICA) composes the programme Farmers' Africa, financed by the EU. The financing from the EU is channelled to AgriCord through IFAD.</p>

Established in 2006 as a permanent feature of the IFAD Governing Council and operationalized through IFAD-funded investment projects and grant programmes, the Farmers' Forum is fully aligned with IFAD's strategic objectives, and is rooted in concrete partnership and collaboration at country and regional levels. Over the past 8 years, the FAFO process has demonstrated its relevance and indeed changed the way IFAD and FOs are working together. Since its inception, FAFO has received supplementary funding from Italy, Switzerland, France, Finland and B&MGF. In 2015 IFAD continue in the effort to make the FAFO a self-sustainable process through the mobilization of supplementary funds from Foundations on a multi-year basis. WEATHER RISK MANAGEMENT					
With initial support of the Bill and Melinda Gates Foundation (US\$1 million) in 2008 IFAD and the WFP established the joint Weather Risk Management Facility (WRMF), to develop index insurance with the World Food Programme. Since 2008 the WRMF has been conducting research, building capacity, and implementing initiatives to improve index insurance product offerings and the way they are delivered. In 2014 France agreed to support the Phase II of the project 'Improving weather risk management in Sub-Saharan Africa: satellites for insuring smallholders' with EUR 500,000. The IFAD-WFP WRMF has been working to address the challenges weather risk (particularly drought) poses for smallholders producing crops in rural areas and to evaluate and review 36 weather index insurance programmes. A main challenge is that, to develop an index insurance contract, historical daily data sets (ideally of about 20 years or more) are necessary, as well as the capacity to capture current data in order to know when a payout should be triggered.

Canada supported the launch of the initiative as a multi-donor facility. Germany subsequently made a contribution with country specific (Brazil, Zambia, Ghana, Indonesia) and sector focused earmarking that promote value chains within specific crops, fish or livestock high nutritional contents relevant for smallholder production and consumption. The two projects are mutually reinforcing. Under the agreement with Canada IFAD is to strengthening its technical capacity in nutrition issues, through additional staff and improved links with CG programs on agriculture and nutrition. The grant from Germany supports the development of operational guidelines for the design of nutrition-sensitive value chain (NSVC) projects in middle-income countries (Nigeria and Indonesia have been selected). Little concrete information exists about how to design such value chains, particularly in the context of value chains for smallholders and the rural poor. FOOD LOSS REDUCTION 2013-2016					
<p>In 2013 the Swiss Agency for Development Co-operation (SDC) through their Global Programme on Food Security (GPFS) under the theme "Reducing food losses through post-harvest management" - launched the joint RBA programme through FAO. The project aims at improving food security and income generation opportunities through reduction of food losses in supported food grains and pulses value chains. The project activities will be focused on establishing a global community of practices on food losses, support policy development, and include pilot activities on food loss assessments and reduction in three selected countries: Burkina Faso, Democratic Republic of the Congo, and Uganda. All three RBAs have strong organisational commitments to the global reduction of food losses. By leveraging their strengths, the project will have significant influence and impact in both raising awareness on losses and in stimulating change in member countries to take action for food loss reduction. A new supplementary fund agreement between IFAD and Ireland was signed in 2013 to enable the use of US\$174,880 - which had remained unspent under a previous partnership agreement - to support the "Food loss reduction through partnerships and evidence-based interventions" which aims at providing technical support on food losses to both FAO and IFAD operations. It is linked with field-based activities led by IFAD including national loss assessments in Timor-Leste, Ethiopia and Malawi, a regional workshop on food losses; and development of awareness and knowledge materials.</p>

<p>Since 1995 IFAD has received US\$15million SF from Japan, Norway, Germany, Canada, Finland, The Netherlands and Italy under nine agreements to achieve more impact on reducing poverty and increasing household food security by: (i) building IFAD's capacity at HQs and country level reaching more rural women through gender-sensitive programme design and implementation; (ii) working in partnership with other institutions and organization; (iii) developing and testing innovative methodologies; (iv) empowering women and their organizations by creating their legal awareness. On 26 November 2012 IFAD signed a 5-year joint programme with UN Women, FAO and WFP for accelerating progress towards the economic empowerment of rural women (RWEE-Joint Programme). The Joint Programme is articulated around four outcome areas: (i) Improved food security and nutrition; (ii) Increased income opportunities; (iii) Enhanced leadership and participation; and (iv) More gender responsive policy environment. The Joint Programme enhances as well the role of young women by specifically targeting them throughout its four outcome areas and its activities. The following seven countries are targeted for the implementation of the Joint Programme: Ethiopia, Guatemala, Kyrgyzstan, Liberia, Nepal, Niger and Rwanda. The programme is administered by the UNDP-Multipartner Trust Fund (MPTF) with whom the four agencies have signed a multidonor administration agreement in 2014. Norway and Sweden - through the Swedish International Development Agency (SIDA) - have contributed NOK10million (US\$1.2million equivalent) and SEK 112,000,000 (US\$15million).</p>
