GOVERNING COUNCIL 2026

THE PROGRAMME

The forty-ninth session of the Governing Council of IFAD (GC49) takes place over two days. The first day, Tuesday, 10 February, is the High-level Segment of the Governing Council with Leaders' Dialogues, while the second day, Wednesday, 11 February, is focused on matters related to governance and partnership.

The formal session will be preceded on Monday, 9 February, by a pre-event day. It will bring together a wide range of partners and offer opportunities for bilateral meetings among delegates and with IFAD Management and staff. **A Briefing Session on Governance at IFAD** will give an overview of IFAD's governance framework, decision-making in IFAD's governing bodies and the roles and engagement of Member States in defining the Fund's strategic direction. The session will also provide information on the proposed implementation of an electronic in-presence and closed voting system at IFAD, which may be used for the appointment of the President of IFAD at the fiftieth session of the Governing Council in February 2027, if required.

HIGH-LEVEL SEGMENT. This will feature keynote addresses, a
Centre Stage Event and Leaders' Dialogues with special high-level
guests. The first day will conclude with a special event marking the
10th anniversary of the Governing Council's adoption of the International
Day of Family Remittances.

GOVERNANCE AND PARTNERSHIPS. There will be a forward-looking focus on IFAD throughout the second day, which will include the consideration of business items, the annual Governors' Round Table, an exploration of priorities for the upcoming Consultation on the Fourteenth Replenishment of IFAD's Resources (IFAD14), Governors' Dialogues and other events that celebrate the power of partnerships.

IFAD fulfils a unique role in rural transformation as an innovative specialized agency of the United Nations and an international financial institution that promotes and invests in rural areas and rural women, youth and men to render them prosperous, equitable and resilient contributors to national growth.

The overarching theme of the Governing Council is "**From Farm to Market: Investing with Young Entrepreneurs**". There are 1.3 billion young people in the world today – the largest generation in history, and nearly half of them live in rural areas. These young women and men face deep challenges: limited access to land, finance, skills and decent jobs, while climate change and migration pressures weigh heavily on their communities. Yet they also represent one of the greatest untapped

opportunities of our time. With their energy, resilience, and openness to innovation, youth are already reimagining agriculture and food systems: adopting digital solutions, driving green transitions and reshaping value chains from farm to market.

IFAD recognizes that youth are not just the future, they are the present. By investing in their entrepreneurial potential, we can unlock new pathways for employment, reduce poverty and inequality, and ensure that rural areas become thriving engines of stability, prosperity and sustainable growth.

This session takes place at the beginning of the **International Year** of the **Woman Farmer**, declared in recognition of the key role that women farmers around the world play in agrifood systems and their contributions to food security, nutrition and poverty eradication. It comes at a time when we need to redouble our efforts to address the root causes of fragility, conflict and forced migration and overcome the discrimination and challenges faced by rural youth and women farmers so that they may realize their potential as drivers of economic and social development and transformed rural areas.

IFAD remains committed to fostering innovation and sustainable growth by investing in rural people and transforming rural economies. Women make up more than half of IFAD's project participants, while over 60 per cent of our active project portfolio is youth-sensitive, reaching more than 12 million young people globally. We firmly believe that empowering youth and women entrepreneurs to initiate and expand agribusinesses will serve as a vital catalyst for economic development and create lasting positive impacts. By investing in the next generation of innovative farmers and entrepreneurs, we aim to build resilient, inclusive economies that benefit all.

The forty-ninth session of the Governing Council will also mark the **establishment of the IFAD14 Consultation** and provide a forum for Governors to share their insights on priority areas for strategic action. This discussion will continue at the **launch of the IFAD14 Consultation** on Thursday, 12 February, with Consultation members.

10.30-12.30 Centre Stage Event - Young Entrepreneurs at the Heart of Transformation: From Vision to Impact

Plenary Hall, open to all delegates

This session will highlight the transformative potential of youth entrepreneurship in revitalizing rural economies and food systems, and will kick off with a fireside chat between IFAD's President and Mr Tony Elumelu, founder of The Tony Elumelu Foundation. The foundation is the leading philanthropic organization in Africa, empowering a new generation of entrepreneurs, driving poverty eradication, catalysing job creation across all 54 African countries, and increasing women's economic empowerment. The discussion will be led by a dynamic panel of young entrepreneurs exploring investment opportunities in the next generation of leaders and innovators. They will also share inspiring stories about their journey from farm to markets.

15.00–16.00 Leaders' Dialogue – New Frontiers for IFIs: Financing Rural Development at the First Mile

This session will explore tools and partnership approaches among international financial institutions (IFIs) to crowd in finance for the "first mile", namely the rural communities at the beginning of the food value chain, where immense investment opportunities exist to foster growth, employment and prosperity. The discussion will focus on country-driven approaches and platforms that can facilitate larger-scale, more-coordinated investments in market access, resilient infrastructure and digital connectivity, all key for rural development.

16.00–17.00 Leaders' Dialogue – From Farm to Market: Investing in Water Security

Plenary Hall, open to all delegates

As a precursor to the 2026 UN Water Conference, scheduled for December 2026 in the UAE, this event will explore how strategic investments in water security empower small-scale farmers to adapt to climate change and build resilient food systems. We bring together high-level decision makers and technical experts from IFAD and other development finance institutions to highlight how water security is a cornerstone for a prosperous and food-secure future for all.

17.00–17.45 Special Event – Decade of the International Day of Family Remittances (IDFR)

Plenary Hall, open to all delegates

The International Day of Family Remittances is a United Nations observance championed by IFAD and embraced by governments, the private sector and civil society worldwide. This event marks a decade since the establishment of the IDFR, and together we will celebrate the power of migrants and their families to transform rural economies and shape a more inclusive, resilient future.



TONY ELUMELU

Tony O. Elumelu is an African investor, philanthropist, and one of the most prominent voices on Africa's transformation agenda.

He is the Founder and Group Chair of Heirs Holdings, a family-owned investment company, investing in financial services, power, technology, healthcare, energy and hospitality.

Tony Elumelu is the Chair of the United Bank for Africa, which operates in 20 African countries and in France, the United Arab Emirates, the United Kingdom and the United States.

In 2010, he founded <u>The Tony Elumelu Foundation</u> (TEF), Africa's leading philanthropic organization driving entrepreneurship across all 54 African countries. TEF has funded over 24,000 entrepreneurs and built a digital ecosystem valued at US\$100 million that has reached 2.5 million Africans.

A TIME100 honouree (2020), Tony Elumelu holds national honours from Nigeria and Gabon, as well as Belgium's oldest royal order. He serves on global boards including UNICEF Generation Unlimited and the IMF Advisory Council on Entrepreneurship and Growth.
