PLANNED PROJECT ACTIVITIES 2001 – 2002

GRANTS UNDER THE SPECIAL OPERATIONS FACILITY APPROVED BY THE PRESIDENT

- 1. At its Third Special Session held on 17 January 1986, the Executive Board authorized the President to provide for preparatory activities directly related to the Fund's lending operations under the Special Programme for Sub-Saharan African Countries Affected by Drought and Desertification, to be undertaken before or after loan effectiveness, by assisting with funding up to the level of USD 600 000 and USD 250 000, respectively, for each proposal.
- 2. At its Eighteenth Session in January 1995, the Governing Council adopted Resolution 85/XVIII, which extended the authority of the President to approve Special Operations Facility (SOF) grants under the Regular Programme. Such grants would be provided to IFAD borrowers entitled to highly concessional terms and on the basis of strict priority criteria.
- 3. A description of 12 grants approved by the President of IFAD under the SOF, designated as Annex D of document EB 2001/72/R.28, is attached.

It will also finance the field testing of participatory diagnostic, planning and evaluation tools for the project.

These activities will include: (i) a study of the microenterprise sector; (ii) strengthening the institutional capacity of local service providers and the management capacity of savings and credit associations; and (iii) providing technical back-stopping for the establishment of a monitoring and evaluation (M&E) system and following up on the recommendations of the re-launching workshop.
