RESOURCES AVAILABLE FOR COMMITMENT

Resources Available for Commitment

1. For the information of the Executive Board, Attachments I and II contain details regarding the resources available for commitment under IFAD's Regular Programme as at 30 June 2001.

2. Attachment I shows that the net resources available for commitment as of 30 June 2001 stood at USD 3.6 million, applying 30 June 2001 exchange rates. Had the Fifth Replenishment been effective by 30 June 2001, this would have resulted in an increase in resources of some USD 23.3 million.

3. Attachment II provides details on Member States' contributions specifically excluded from committable resources as of 30 June 2001.

4. Attachment III provides details of loans and grants approved by the Executive Board at its Seventy-Second Session in April 2001.

5. Attachment IV provides details on loans and grants, amounting to approximately SDR 114.3 million, being presented to the current Session of the Executive Board. Based on exchange rates in force as of 30 June 2001, these loans and grants are worth some USD 142.4 million.

6. Given that the resources available for commitment as of 30 June 2001 are not sufficient to cover the expected level of loans and grants to be approved at the current Session of the Executive Board, recourse is being made to the Advance Commitment Authority (ACA), as provided for in paragraph III.17 of Resolution 119/XXIV of the Governing Council. This is recommended in paragraph 11 of this document.

The Advance Commitment Authority

7. At its Twentieth Session in February 1997, the Governing Council authorized the use of the ACA. The main purpose of the ACA is to cover shortfalls in the amount of committable resources available to approve loans and grants that may arise in a particular year due to delays in the receipt of contribution payments, volatility in the rate of return of investment income and/or delays in the receipt of payments and repayments under loans provided by the Fund.

8. With the adoption of Resolution 119/XXIV on the Fifth Replenishment on 31 July 2000, the ACA was extended until one year following the end of the Fifth Replenishment period, i.e. until 19 February 2005. The Executive Board is to establish the cumulative resource level available under the ACA. Further information regarding the ACA can be found in the document EB 2001/73/INF.3.

9. At the Seventy-Second Session of the Executive Board, the statement of Resources Available for Commitment, prepared as at 31 March 2001, stood at USD 15.0 million, compared to approximately USD 84.6 million in proposed loans and grants to be approved. In order to be able to approve all loans and grants submitted for approval, the Board approved the use of up to USD 70.0 million under the ACA. This was the first time in the history of IFAD that the use of the ACA was approved.

10. As can be seen in Attachment V, the inflows received during the period 1 April to 30 June 2001 are sufficient to reverse out the full amount of the ACA (USD 69.6 million) that was used in order to approve the loans and grants presented for approval at the Seventy-Second Session of the Executive Board. An update to this document will be provided to Member States at its Seventy-Third Session to indicate the estimated level of ACA required to approve the proposed programme of work, based on the resource situation calculated at a date shortly prior to the Executive Board. The figures included in the recommendation will be updated accordingly.

Recommendation

11. Based on the resource position as at 30 June 2001, the Executive Board is requested to approve the use of the ACA, as follows:

"The Executive Board, in accordance with paragraph III.17 of Governing Council Resolution 119/XXIV, and noting a present shortfall in resources of an estimated USD 138.8 million due to resources available for commitment of USD 3.6 million and loans and grants presented for approval of USD 142.4 million, approves the use of up to USD 138.8 million under the ACA and accordingly authorizes the President to conclude agreements for loans and grants approved by the Executive Board at its Seventy-Third Session in September 2001. In addition, it requests the President to report to the Executive Board at its next and subsequent sessions on the use of the ACA and the resources available for commitment."

Projected Resources

12. As seen above, the Executive Board is hereby asked to approve use of the ACA at its Seventy-Third Session. Management expect that by the end of 2001 the level of inflows received will be sufficient to cover the ACA commitments made to date. These inflows may derive from one or more of the following sources:

- (i) loan repayments (in the past, this has represented a very stable resource base);
- (ii) contributions (principally on the basis that the Fifth Replenishment will become effective by year's end); and
- (iii) investment income (depending on prevailing market conditions).
