Addendum

- 1. For the information of the Executive Board, and as stated in document EB 2009/97/R.13, Management has prepared an update of the estimated resources available for commitment under IFAD's Regular Programme. The aforementioned document had estimated an additional advance commitment authority (ACA) requirement of US\$75.8 million. As result of estimated net inflows in the eight month period of US\$ 377.2 million, no additional ACA is now being requested at this session of the Executive Board. The estimated net inflows primarily consist of US\$213.9 million of contributions, US\$168.5 million of loan reflows and US\$79.0 million investment income, partially offset by additional outflows of US\$82.2 million for operating expenditures.
- 2. Attachment II shows estimated total net resource inflows from 1 January to 31 August 2009 of US\$377.2 million. Loan and grant commitments proposed to the current session of the Board total US\$229.4 million. Taking into account these net flows and commitments, as well as grants already approved of US\$215.7 million and ACA already approved of US\$76.5 million, no additional ACA needs to be approved at this session of the Executive Board.
