Appointment of members to the Working Group on the Performance-based Allocation System

I. Background

- 1. The Working Group on the Performance-based Allocation System (PBAS) is currently the only working group of the Executive Board.
- 2. At its eighty-seventh session in April 2006, the Executive Board agreed to the suggestion to convene a working group, as referred to in the Report of the Consultation on the Seventh Replenishment of IFAD's Resources approved by the Governing Council, to develop a broader understanding of evolving issues in PBAS implementation. An informal seminar was convened on 6 July 2006 to develop the work programme of the group.
- 3. In December 2006, the Board was informed of the terms of reference, the composition of the working group and the election of the member from India as its chairperson. The outgoing composition of the working group is as follows:

List A: France, Italy, Sweden, United States

List B: Nigeria, Venezuela (Bolivarian Republic of)

List C: Sub-List C1: Mali
Sub-List C2: India
Sub-List C3: Mexico

- 4. In the Report of the Consultation on the Eighth Replenishment of IFAD's Resources approved by the Governing Council in February 2009, the Board was requested to mandate the PBAS Working Group to continue its functions and, as well, review the practices of other international financial institutions (IFIs) and identify improvements to the system. Possible areas for examination include: the relative weight of different elements of the PBAS formula, the current level of minimum and maximum allocations and the possible need for exceptional allocations for particularly vulnerable countries, in addition to the current support for post-conflict countries. The reallocation approaches of other IFIs would also be examined. The PBAS Working Group would review and assess all such proposals, which would subsequently be presented to the Executive Board and Governing Council for their consideration and approval.
- 5. Following the appointment of members to the standing committees of the Executive Board, namely the Audit Committee and the Evaluation Committee, the Board is requested to consider the composition of the PBAS Working Group with a view to aligning its composition with that of the Executive Board, as appropriate.

II. Recommendation

6. Following consultation with the three Lists of IFAD Member States and in accordance with rule 11.1 of the Rules of Procedure of the Executive Board, the Board is hereby invited to approve the appointment of the following members to the Working Group on the Performance-based Allocation System:

List A: France, Italy, Sweden, United States

List B: Nigeria, Venezuela (Bolivarian Republic of)

List C: Sub-List C1: Burkina Faso (April 2009 – December 2010)

Cameroon (January 2011 - April 2012)

Sub-List C2: Turkey (2009)¹

Sub-List C3: Mexico

7. Pursuant to rule 11.1 of the Rules of Procedure of the Executive Board, the working group will elect a chairperson from among its members and the Board will be informed accordingly.

In accordance with the rotation of membership of the Executive Board agreed to within sub-List C2 (Turkey for 2009, Pakistan for 2010 and Bangladesh for 2011), said rotation will also apply to Sub-list C2 membership's of the PBAS working group.

Terms of reference of the Working Group on the Performance-based Allocation System

An informal seminar was held on 6 July to review the terms of reference of the working group and it was agreed that the working group would subsequently nominate a chairperson. The terms of reference were agreed with the aim of:

"Developing a broader understanding of evolving issues in PBAS implementation including:

- modifications of elements of the formula, including performance assessments, and the weights of population and income, while maintaining the overall weight of performance;
- the experience and lessons learned from other agencies implementing PBAS initiatives;
- the data to be used for rural population;
- the implementation of the PBAS for concessional and non-concessional borrowers; and
- other potential indicators of poverty such as nutrition and per capita rural income levels."
