1. **Opening of the session**

The 133rd session of the Evaluation Committee will be held on Thursday, 18 June 2026, at IFAD headquarters, Via Paolo di Dono 44, Rome. The session will take place in the Oval Room (S-120) from 10 a.m. to 5.15 p.m.

2. **Adoption of the agenda**

The provisional agenda of the 133rd session is contained in the present document.

3. **Country strategy and programme evaluation for the Republic of Chad**

The country strategy and programme evaluation for the Republic of Chad is the first such evaluation conducted in the country by the Independent Office of Evaluation of IFAD (IOE). It covers the period 2013–2024. The evaluation assesses the results and performance of the IFAD-financed strategy and programme in Chad and presents findings and recommendations for the future partnership between the Government and IFAD. The Committee is also invited to review the related agreement at completion point signed by the Government and IFAD Management, which is contained in the addendum.

4. **Approach paper for the corporate-level evaluation of IFAD's supplementary resources**

The corporate-level evaluation (CLE) of IFAD's supplementary resources is the first independent, comprehensive assessment of IFAD's performance in mobilizing, managing and utilizing its supplementary resources. This evaluation is particularly timely, given the growing stature of such resources in IFAD, and their increasingly dominant role in global development financing. The findings, conclusions and recommendations of the CLE will support IFAD Management and staff in the mobilization, management and use of these resources for deeper impact, and will inform future strategies and replenishment consultation deliberations in this regard. The CLE will cover the period 2016–2025. The paper provides the background to the evaluation, along with the objectives and planned evaluation methodology and process, including evaluation questions, timeframe and deliverables. The Committee is invited to review the approach paper before its finalization.

5. **Proposed dates for sessions of the Evaluation Committee in 2027**

The proposed dates for sessions of the Evaluation Committee in 2027 are presented for the approval of the Committee. The main objective of the document is to book meeting dates in advance so as to avoid scheduling conflicts with other major events planned by the Food and Agriculture Organization of the United Nations, IFAD and the World Food Programme during the same period.

6. **Draft report of the external peer review of IFAD's evaluation function**

The document contains the draft report of the third external peer review of IFAD's evaluation function, prepared by the Evaluation Cooperation Group of multilateral development banks, as approved by the Executive Board in December 2024. IOE and Management's comments on this report, for consideration by Committee members, are contained in the related addendum. The document will be submitted to the Executive Board at its 148th session in September.

7. **Country strategy and programme evaluation for the Plurinational State of Bolivia**

The country strategy and programme evaluation for the Plurinational State of Bolivia is the third such evaluation conducted in the country by IOE. It covers the period 2015–2024. The evaluation assesses the results and performance of the IFAD-financed strategy and programme in Bolivia and presents findings and recommendations for the future partnership between the Government and IFAD.

The Committee is also invited to review the related agreement at completion point signed by the Government and IFAD Management, which is contained in the addendum.

8. **Country strategy and programme evaluation for the Republic of Honduras**

The country strategy and programme evaluation for the Republic of Honduras is the second such evaluation conducted in the country by IOE. It covers the period 2013–2024. The evaluation assesses the results and performance of the IFAD-financed strategy and programme in Honduras and presents findings and recommendations for the future partnership between the Government and IFAD. The Committee is also invited to review the related agreement at completion point signed by the Government and IFAD Management, which is contained in the addendum.
