









Closing Ceremony Understanding and addressing gender-based violence in the context of COVID-19: reaching rural women, girls, men and boys	Human Rights Day In commemoration of Human Rights Day FAO, in collaboration with IFAD and WFP, will host a virtual event to raise awareness of the troubling rise in gender-based violence (GBV) in the context of COVID-19. This virtual event will bring together speakers to discuss the importance of preventing and mitigating this pervasive violation of human rights. Discussants will share examples from the field, approaches designed to change harmful gender norms, the challenge of collecting data on gender-based violence, and the importance of ensuring that GBV is considered in the policy response to COVID-19 at all levels of government.
