PERFORMANCE MANAGEMENT

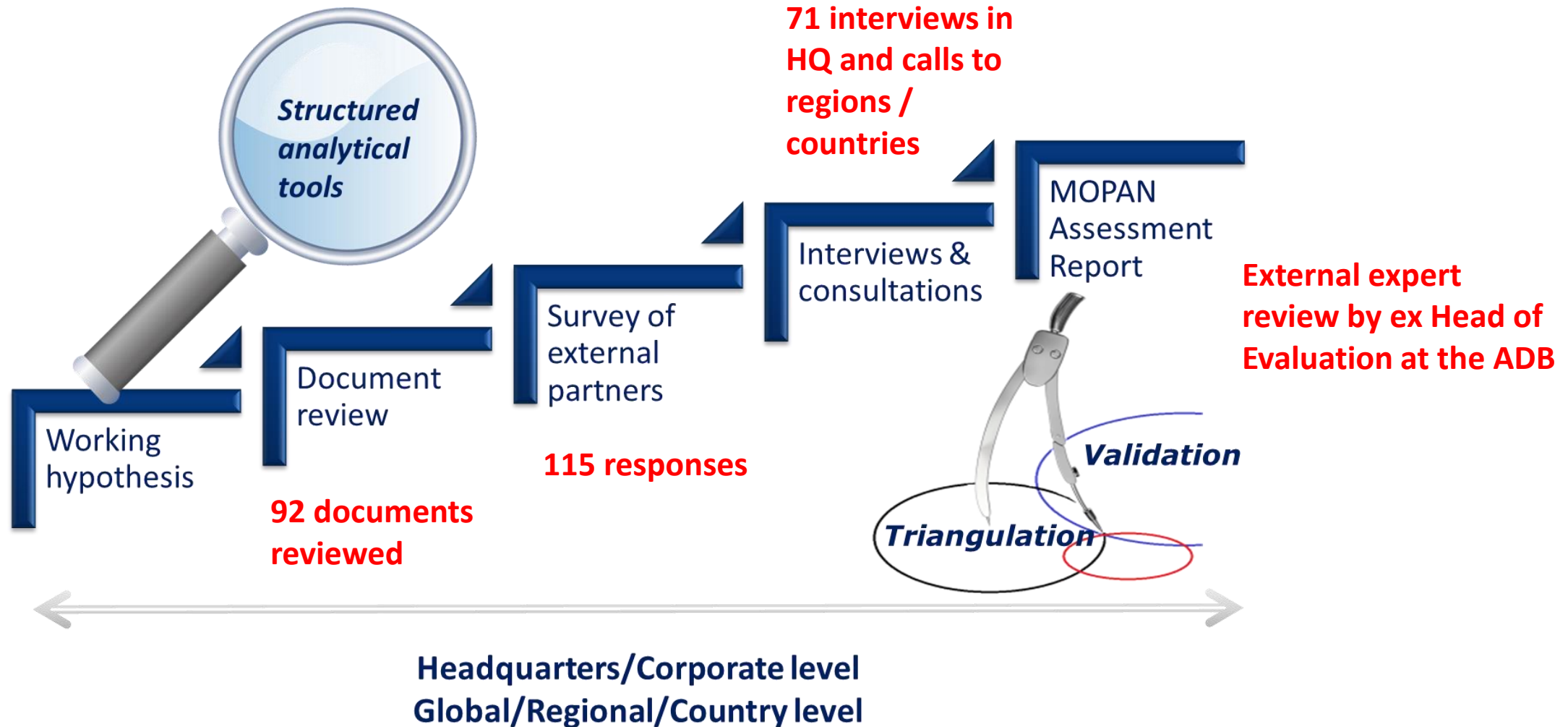
Systems geared to managing and accounting for development and humanitarian results and the use of performance information, including evaluation and lesson-learning
