I. Background

- 1. At its eighty-seventh session in April 2006, the Executive Board agreed to convene a Working Group on the Performance-based Allocation System as referred to in the Consultation Report approved by the Governing Council. The Working Group was thus established by decision of the Executive Board, pursuant to rule 11 of the Rules of Procedure of the Executive Board.
